Mission Fulfillment – Core Objective 1

FISCAL YEAR 2024 Core Objective 1: Provide Access to Higher Education to All Students

Mission: The University of Alaska Southeast is a student-centered university that provides instruction in liberal arts, professional, and technical fields. On the homelands of the Tlingit, Haida, and Tsimshian peoples, we serve the coastal environments, cultures, economies, and communities of Alaska, through interdisciplinary education, workforce development, and scholarship, research, and creative activity.

UAS programs are delivered through three major academic units: the School of Arts and Sciences, the School of Career Education, and the School of Education. Arts and Sciences makes up the largest unit, encompassing four departments: Humanities, Social Sciences, Natural Sciences, and Business/Public Administration. The campus settings and rich natural, social, and cultural environment of Southeast Alaska provide generous opportunities for teaching, research, and creative expression in these areas.

UAS continues to see slight enrollment declines. This reduction is attributable, in part, to declining numbers of high school graduates and Alaska's overall falling and aging population. These trends continue to be more pronounced in Southeast Alaska than elsewhere in the State. State general fund support for UA has leveled off. University leaders focus on diversifying revenue streams to support academic and workforce programs and faculty, staff, and students based on the UAS mission.

In July 2023, UAS welcomed a new Chancellor, Dr. Aparna Palmer. Under her leadership and a stabilized budget, UAS reviewed the enrollment goals and chose to revisit the targets based on Fall 2023 data. Student headcount was not on track to meet previously identified goals. The revised enrollment targets are more achievable than the previous targets. UAS has identified a 1% enrollment target in Fall 2024 and a 2%l target for Fall 2025, for a total 3% growth from Fall 2023.

The UAS Chancellor's Strategic Enrollment Task Force continues to meet. Participants in this group represent our three campuses, academics, student services, and administration. The committee uses the current Enrollment Plan, Hanover Research data, UAS Institutional Effectiveness data, and the Alaska Native Success Initiative recommendations to guide their work. In the fall of 2023, Chancellor Palmer reviewed and approved the updated <u>Strategic Enrollment Plan</u> (SEP). The plan continues to focus on recruitment, retention, and marketing efforts designed to boost enrollment. This SEP includes brief annual marketing, recruitment, and retention strategies for FY24 and will be reviewed and updated annually.
