Core Objective 3: Increase Student Success

Mission: The University of Alaska Southeast is a student-centered university that provides instruction in liberal arts, professional, and technical fields. On the homelands of the Tlingit, Haida, and Tsimshian peoples, we serve the coastal environments, cultures, economies, and communities of Alaska, through interdisciplinary education, workforce development, and scholarship, research, and creative activity.

A fundamental aspect of UAS' mission is student success. It highlights the importance UAS places in providing its students access to the academic support they need to succeed, regardless of their physical location (campus-based or online) or whether they are pursuing workforce training, undergraduate or graduate degrees, or simply seeking opportunities for lifelong learning. Culturally and socioeconomically diverse students are provided ready access to educational opportunities and a safe environment.

Our programs are designed for all types of students – high school, transfer, technical/trade, degree-seeking, professional development, and lifelong learners – and their unique educational goals. UAS provides everything necessary for students to succeed: an environment conducive to learning, easy access to professors and resources, and opportunities to practice.

UAS made great strides in retention, with the fall 2022 cohort having achieved a retention rate of 71%, compared to 65% for the fall 2021 cohort. In response, we updated the retention goal to 73% by Fall 2025 (previously 68%). There are a number of initiatives within the Strategic Enrollment Plan that specifically focus on retention efforts that we will focus on in academic year 2024. Recently, UAS has partnered with the Gardner Institute through the 'Transforming the Foundational Postsecondary Experience' cohort. The Foundational Postsecondary Experience refers to the critical first two years of college education and typically involves the accumulation of sixty semester credits toward a degree. Through a process of system redesign, we are one of eleven institutions in the first cohort to develop and implement plans over a five-year period to close inequitable performance gaps, enhance teaching and learning practices, and promote student success, completion, and retention.

The student success metrics are based on IPEDS standard reporting methodology. However, other cohorts and more student success measures are tracked internally. These can be found in the resources linked above and disaggregated success measures can be found in the appendix below.

Definitions of student success metrics:

- The fall to fall retention rate is all incoming first-time full-time bachelor's seeking freshmen who returned the following fall term.
- The 150% overall completion rate is the graduation rate of all first-time full-time freshmen who completed any degree within 150% time to degree (ex. Completed a bachelor's degree in 6 years, completed an associate's degree in 3 years)
- The 150% bachelor's completion rate is the graduation rate of all first-time full-time bachelor seeking freshmen who completed a bachelor degree within 6 years.
- The 200% bachelor's completion rate is the graduation rate of all first-time full-time bachelor seeking freshmen who completed a bachelor degree within 8 years.
- Percentage of recent graduates who are currently employed in Alaska one year after graduation

For example, the full-time persistence rate of all students is 93%, while persistence for rural students in this category (full-time) is 10% less, or 83%. Student groups that are 5% or more below the overall rate are highlighted in red and student groups that are 5% or more above the overall rate are highlighted in green. Categories with less than 10 students are listed as 'na'.

Certificate Seeking: Fall to Spring Persistence Rate (Re-Enrolled their 2nd Term)
