- Jason Amundson was awarded a \$155k NSF grant, along with collaborators at UAF and Middlebury College, entitled "Disentangling runoff- and terminus-driven velocity variations of fast flowing outlet glaciers". - UAS undergraduates Ellie Bretscher and Cassandra Suryan presented their research on glacier outburst floods and iceberg calving, respectively, at the Alaska Space Grant Program's annual meeting at UAA on April 7. (excellence, sustainability, collaboration)

- Andrzej Piotrowski was awarded a Dolciani Mathematical Enrichment Grant from the Mathematical Association of America to support events for the local high school math club next year (23-24). This includes funding for an event on the UAS Juneau campus. (excellence, access, collaboration)
- Megan Behnke (ACRC) and Jason Fellman had an article accepted for publication in the Journal of Geophysical Research: Biogeosciences entitled "Trees in the stream: Determining patterns of terrestrial dissolved organic matter contributions to the northeast Pacific coastal temperate rainforest." (excellence, collaboration, sustainability)
- Julie Schram had an article published in the Journal of Experimental Marine Biology and Ecology entitled "Juvenile Dungeness crab foraging behavior and lipid composition is altered more by food quantity than seawater pH in a multi-stressor experiment".
 Co-authors include 2 undergraduates and a high school teacher who were instrumental in completing the project and writing it up. (https://doi.org/10.1016/j.jembe.2023.151897) (excellence, collaboration, stewardship)
- Heidi Pearson, in collaboration with the Portuguese non-profit AIMM, was awarded a \$498,000 contract from the Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission entitled, "Scientific experiment to evaluate dolphin cow-calf separation during purse seine fishing operations in the Eastern Tropical Pacific". This research will use drones to determine if dolphin calves become separated from their mothers during high-speed chases into tuna purse seine nets, which could lead to calf mortality and hindrance of recovery of spinner and spotted dolphin populations. (excellence, sustainability, collaboration)
- Heidi Pearson was interviewed about her research for the Utah Public Radio Program, UnDisciplined. (excellence, access)
- John Harley (ACRC) presented his research on modeling and forecasting of shellfish toxins at the Alaska Harmful Algal Bloom network workshop in Anchorage. The meeting was attended by state and federal agencies, researchers, and tribal representatives. (excellence, sustainability)
- Megan Behnke (ACRC) and Jason Fellman hosted a half-day meeting with agency partners for their project titled "Impacts of cryospheric change on aquatic flows and freshwater habitat quality for fish across Alaska." Along with their collaborator Ryan Bellmore (USFS), they heard from researchers and managers from across the state of Alaska to learn about what rivers and under what future climate change scenarios it would be most useful for them to explore how riverine food webs might change in the future.
