Website

Last Name, First. Middle Initial. (Year, Month Date [use n.d. if not given]). *Title of page*. Site name. <internet address>

Book

Last Name, First. Middle Initial. (Year of publication). *Title of work: Capital letter also for subtitle*. Publisher Name. DOI* (If available)

Online Journal Article

Last name, First. Middle Initial., & Last name, First. Middle Initial. (Year). Title of article. *Title of Periodical, Vol.*(Issue), pp. #. DOI or <internet address>

Examples

*DOI (Digital Object Identifier) is a unique identification number assigned to some (but not all) online sources such as books, papers, and articles. A DIO is only required when it is available.

**For a source with three to twenty authors, every author needs to be listed. If there are more than twenty, list the first nineteen, use an ellipsis in place of remaining names, and end with the final author's name. See the final reference for an example.
