Mission: The University of Alaska Southeast is a student-centered university that provides instruction in liberal arts, professional, and technical fields. On the homelands of the Tlingit, Haida, and Tsimshian peoples, we serve the coastal environments, cultures, economies, and communities of Alaska, through interdisciplinary education, workforce development, and scholarship, research, and creative activity.

Institutional Accreditation (Regents Policy 10.02.070A)

The University of Alaska Southeast (UAS) has been accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities (NWCCU) since 1983. This accreditation includes the Juneau, Ketchikan, and Sitka campuses. At UAS, the Provost serves as the Accreditation Liaison Officer and is the primary point of contact for information regarding accreditation.

Institutional accreditation is regularly reviewed and reaffirmed by the NWCCU. UAS's accreditation was reaffirmed in July 2019 following our mid-cycle review. In addition to these reports and visits, we communicate regularly with the NWCCU about substantive program changes including additions, suspensions, and deletions and about changes to institutional leaders and organizational structure.

We are actively engaged in our upcoming accreditation review cycle, a critical process that underscores our commitment to excellence and continuous improvement at UAS. The PRFR (Standard 2) report is due on March 1, 2025, followed by our Standard 1 Self-Evaluation Report on March 1, 2026. To ensure comprehensive and inclusive preparation, we have established an accreditation committee comprising faculty and leaders from across the institution. Each member is tasked with specific sections of the PRFR or Standard 1 documents, with clearly defined deadlines and deliverables assigned by the Provost. Our approach includes submitting early drafts to NWCCU for feedback, recognizing the value of early input from our accrediting body to strengthen our final submissions. This proactive and collaborative effort reflects our dedication to upholding the highest standards in education and institutional effectiveness.

Education

The UAS School of Education received its accreditation from the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP). This accreditation covers both initial and advanced teacher preparation programs. CAEP is recognized by the Alaska Department of Education and Early Development, the U.S. Department of Education, and the Council for Higher Education Accreditation to accredit programs for the preparation of teachers and other professional school personnel. Health Information Management

The Health Information Management Associate Degree (A.A.S.) is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Health Informatics and Information Management Education (CAHIIM). The Health Information Management (HIM) program provides a course of study, using primarily e-Learning methodology, which prepares entry-level health information professionals. Graduates are eligible to write the national examination; successful completion of the examination leads to the professional credential of Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT).

Medical Assisting

The UAS Medical Assisting Certificate program is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) upon the recommendation of the Medical Assisting Education Review Board (MAERB). Medical assistants are multi-skilled health professionals specifically educated to work in a variety of healthcare settings performing clinical and administrative duties. The practice of medical assisting necessitates mastery of a complex body of knowledge and specialized skills requiring both formal education and practical experience that serve as standards for entry into the profession.
